The Prince George Urban Aboriginal Justice Society is accepting applications from interested community members to serve as a Director on the Board.

The mission of the Prince George Urban Aboriginal Justice Society is to reduce the number of Aboriginal people in conflict with the law. The Society recognizes that both preventive and responsive approaches are required. PGUAJS, in consultation with Aboriginal communities, will identify services gaps for Aboriginal people and sponsor initiatives that address the effects of intergenerational poverty, improve education, outreach services, rural transitional support, prevention initiatives and diversion services.

The Board of Directors' Executive Members is comprised of the: Chair, Vice Chair, Secretary and Treasurer with general board member positions. The Board is a governance body that provides support and direction to the Executive Director who is responsible for planning, organizing, directing, controlling, and evaluating all services and programs provided by the Society.

We are seeking individuals with the following Core Competencies:

- Business and Financial Comprehension understanding of budgets,
- Social concerns and historical issues that lead to the criminal justice system,
- Communication able to work as a team in the decision-making process,
- Leadership able to lead the society through growth,
- Strategic goal setting planning and forecasting,

- Understanding and practice of basic rules for respectful debates.
